Dear Nellie

I received your  
welcome letter & was glad to  
find you all well although  
Kean was telling me that Bert  
says Fred has something the  
matter with his leg I hope  
it is not serious as he as  
had enough trouble and he  
seems to be just getting a little  
better off I have not had  
the best of health myself lately  
I am suffering with Gall Stones  
so I have to go through a lot



of pain the doctor wanted me  
to under go an operation but  
I am going to try taking oil I  
have to take  $\frac{1}{2}$  pint of olive oil  
a day to try to dissolve the stones  
that is how he is treating me  
now I lose a good deal of  
time whenever it come on  
I cannot <sup>always</sup> work I could save  
money now if I was alright  
I get  $3\frac{1}{6}$  a week but doctors  
soon run away with it  
I intended to come down  
last saturday week but I got  
a bad turn and could not  
come of course it only comes  
on in bouts some times I am

as well as ever I was, I am  
coming down before long to  
have a look at you all  
so you must be surprised on  
any saturday night to see me  
down there Nedra is getting  
on well in her place her  
mother thinks a lot of her  
she likes being up here now  
I suppose things are much the  
same down there plenty of  
work and no money I think  
wages are better up here  
you can get  $\frac{4}{6}$  a cord for  
cutting stungy bark and it  
is very easy cut a man  
can cut from 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  to 3 cord a day



Doherty had 200 cord cut and  
the rain made of a day at it  
I think I have told you all  
the news how how is today is  
he any better and how is  
Arthur getting on I never hear  
only through you  
write soon and let me know  
all the news & with  
best love to all
